Dear Parents,

Term dates

Uniform

Gates

We have had an increase in children and parents buzzing to be let into the school grounds between 8:25 and 8:30am and then holding the gates open for others to enter which has resulted in pupils being on the

playground unsupervised. This is unacceptable. School gates will be opened by staff members at 8:30. Between 8:25 and 8:30 there will be no access to the site. We will respond over the intercom but the gates will remain closed. During the school day, the only gate that will be opened is the Conway Road gate. This is to keep all of our children safe so please do support us with this.
